The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was first initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). In line with the spirit of South-South Cooperation, Malaysia through the MTCP shares its development experiences and expertise with other developing countries. The MTCP was first formulated based on the belief that the development of a country depends on the quality of its human resources. More than 100 short-term specialised courses are offered by more than 50 MTCP training institutions, many of which are centres of excellence for training. Since its launching, more than 25,000 participants from 140 countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

ABOUT THE COURSE

This course is designed to expose senior officials in the education industry on strategies of managing a private university, using the latest technology and best practices. Senior officials will be exposed to the various electronic and database management system, in sync with strategic and operational implementations in running a private higher learning of institution, where the fiscal and operational challenges are prevalent. Officials will be briefed by relevant departments and faculties. The MEUNI training programme is offered in relation to the Malaysian Government's, Economic T ransformation Programme (ETP) focus by in particular, the Education segment of the National Key Economic Areas (NKEA). MEUNI sets out to achieve the target of NKEA Education's 12th Entry Point Project (EPP), which is Championing Malaysia's Education Brand.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

Understand the basics concepts of managing an e-University. Propose possible database system to be implemented in their respective organisations.

Understand the advantages and challenges in using database technologies and ICT systems for effective management. Identify best practices used in running a private university.

TRAINING METHODOLOGY

GENERAL CONDITION OF AWARDS

Visa and Vaccination

All participants are required to enter Malaysia with Visa with Reference (VDR). The VDR must be applied by the training institutions upon the selection of participants. Once the approval is obtained, the training institutions should send a copy of letter of appoval to the participants. Subsequently, with the copy of the approval, the participants may get the VDR from the nearest Malaysian Missions. The VDR is the prior approval in order to gain the right to enter Malaysia. The details of the VDR r equirement are enclosed under the subheading "Visa Information". Wherever applicable, participants are advised to arrange on their own for vaccination prior to travel to Malaysia.

Manners

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of the land and institutions.

Dress Code

During lectures, male participants are required to dress in long-sleeved shirts with ties, long pants and lounge suits and female participants should be appropriately dressed in office attire. For formal occasions - lounge suit or national costume are required.

Terms and Condition Covered by the MTCP for **International Participants:**

Ø This scholarship cannot be held concurrently with any other scholarship award.

Ø Participants shall follow the programme approved for them. Request for change of programme will not be entertained. Participants should fully participate in all activities related to the programme.

Ø Participants are NOT allowed to participate in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not take up paid employment during the tenure of their scholarship or serve as the staff of their Diplomatic Missions in Malaysia. Ø Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the course. Participants will be required to return to their own countries upon completion of the course or at the end of the tenure of the scholarship whichever is earlier.

Ø The award may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the award, failure to make satisfactory progress or as deemed necessary by the Malaysian training institution with the approval of the MTCP Secretariat. Ø Participants who are found to be medically unfit during the course of the programme will be required to return to their country.

Specific Conditions

Air Fare

The Government of Malaysia shall provide excursion economy class return ticket for the participants except for participants from countries that their GDP per capita have exceeded USD5,000. These countries are as follows:

The course exposes senior officials on matters pertaining to managing a university by fully utilising the available technology. A mixture of briefings and visits will give the participants a lucid picture of managing in the 21st century. At the end of the course, participants are required to propose possible collaborations that will benefit both parties. The medium of communication is English and hence it is essential that the participants be proficient (written and spoken) in the language.

TARGETED PARTICIPANTS

A candidate is eligible for admission only if she/he meets the following requirements:

- Senior Officials, from MTCP recipient countries who are decision makers such as Director Generals of Education, University's Vice Chancellors/Presidents/CEOs, Registrars or senior office bearers. Below 50 years old.
- · Comply with other general requirements for MTCP.

The selection of the successful candidates is made by a committee. Decision of the Committee is final, and hence no appeal for consideration be entertained.

Accommodation and Subsistence Allowance

Accommodation and daily subsistence allowance are as follows: · Participants will be accommodated either in hostel belong to the training institutions or nearby hotel.

• Participants will be given daily allowance of RM85 (USD26).

• However, if the training institutions provide full-board accommodations, the subsistence allowance will not be fully provided.

Tuition Fees

Tuition fees will be borne by the Malaysian Government under the MTCP.

Medical and Dental Treatment

Expenses for medical and dental treatment in government hospitals/clinics will be borne by the Government of Malaysia. In case of admission in government hospitals, participants will be eligible for first class wards (two bedded or more). Dental treatment is restricted to extraction and filling only.
